GUILD MEETING PROTOCOL

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

This month is cutting only. If you've been coming to meetings, then you'll get your stripe fabric swaps back from me next month. If you're working at home, just put aside your stripes. This month we're cutting the Dark and your Background (light) fabric.

From the Background/light fabric, cut five, 5 inch strips. From those strips, cut a total of 84, 5 inch by 2.5 inch strips. If you can't quite get 84 from your strips, then cut the last ones from the rest of your fabric.

Repeat for your dark fabric.

You should have:

84 2.5 by 5 inch rectangles in Background/Light 84 2.5 by 5 inch rectangles in Dark

The first requirement was to gather 42 5-inch striped squares. If you came to the September meeting, and brought the squares with you, Elisabeth took them and will mix them up and bring you back 42 5 inch squares at the October meeting. The next step is to cut 84 light and 84 dark

rectangles - 2 1/2 x 5.

- Since we are unable to have workshops because the church is not fully open, Nichole is thinking ahead to next year. She will have some great ideas to talk about for 2021. She did show an apron that she had made recently as a possibility.
- The Stitch-a-Bit Stitch Group has not yet resumed meetings and won't until the church is fully re-opened.

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PRESIDENT'S QUILT


It's time once again to recognize our president. Shirley is finishing up her 2nd year as president and will rotate off the end of this year. To thank her for her service, we will be making quilt blocks. She has asked for our Guild's block, the Prairie Queen as her block this year. She would like it to be done in 30s prints and if you use a background color to use off-white. The block pattern is included in this newsletter (below) and is 12 1/2 " unfinished. Examples of 30s prints are also included in this newsletter (right). Please bring your blocks to me by the October meeting. If it's easier for you to mail them to me, you may do that as well. Be sure that you pin a slip of paper with your name to your block. The blocks will be presented to Shirley at the December meeting.

PRAIRIE QUEEN

PUT TOGETHER AS SHOWN




This block shows the true pioneer spirit of making something wonderful out of a simple 9-Patch design. You can make your "Prairie Queen" block predominantly dark or light (Fabric I will be the dominant fabric since it includes the block center and corners).

FROM FABRIC 1:

Cut eight 2½" squares (for 4-Patch units) Cut one 4½" square (block center)

Cut two 5" squares (for triangle/squares)



FROM FABRIC 2


Cut eight 2½" squares (for 4-Patch units) Cut two 5" squares (for triangle/squares)

TO ASSEMBLE "PRAIRIE QUEEN" BLOCK: Begin by sewing the 2½" squares together to form the four 4-Patch units. He sure to use ¼" seams and press seams to the dark fabric to help you match up points.

NOTE TO STRIP PIECERS: If you prefer, cut 2½" dark and light strips, sew strips together, press then recut

into 2½" light/dark units. Sew two light/dark units together to form each 4-Patch unit. Your strips will need to be 21-22" long to allow you to square up cuts as needed.

To make the triangle/squares for the corners, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 5" light fabric squares (this will



be your cutting line ...but don't cut yet!) Draw your sewing lines (use of a colored pencil is helpful) ¼" from your diagonal cutting line ...one on each side of the diagonal line. Place light and dark 5" squares good sides together and sew on the sewing lines. Now cut on the diagonal cutting line and you have two triangles/squares. Repeat with the other 5" square. Press seams to dark side and trim to 4½" square if necessary – be sure the diagonal seam line runs from corner to corner when trimming.

Lay out the block units as shown in the diagram, then sew units into rows, then the rows into your completed block... the Prairie Queen".
