Elisabeth's Bat Block

Fabric:

Moon:

1 x 4.5 inch square

Background:

7 x 4.5 inch squares

1 x 2.5 inch square

1 x 3 inch square

4 x 1.5 inch squares

Bat:


4 x 4.5 inch squares

1 x 1.5 inch square


1 x 2.5 inch square

1 x 3 inch square

Using the BG 1.5 inch squares, snowball the corners of the moon square.




Make the bat tail by using the Bat 1.5 in square to snowball one corner of a BG 4.5 inch square.



Using the BG 3 inch square and the Bat 3 inch square, make 2 HSTs.


Place two squares of fabric right side together. Draw a line diagonally from one corner to the opposite corner. Sew 1/4" from either side of the line. Cut along the drawn line. Trim these down to 2.5 inch.

Use the 2 HSTs, 1 x Bat 2.5 square and 1 BG 2.5 square to make the bat head:




Fold the Bat 4.5 inch squares corner-to-corner (right sides out) and press.

Lay each folded triangle on top of a BG 4.5 inch square and pin.



Create the nine-patch bat block as shown, taking care to catch all raw edges in the seams:



Tack down each "flap" with a few stitches (either hand or machine) at the X spot.

In each square with a flap, fold back the fabric and machine topstitch, to make the bat's "webbing".
